Twenty Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time 13<sup>th</sup> October Psalter Week 4 - Year C

#### First Reading: 2 Kings 5:14-17

This Sunday's First Reading tells of God's healing of Naaman, the Syrian army commander, from his leprosy, through his prophet, Elisha. Naaman's own gratitude, his begging Elisha to "accept a gift from your servant" calls us to reflect on the great gifts the Lord has given each of us, and give thanks to him by reflecting his love, as Naaman did, by sacrificing for our neighbor – half a block and half a world away.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 97
The Lord has shown his salvation to the nations -

#### Second Reading: 2 Timothy 2:8-13

Saint Paul's letters often tell of his sufferings for the sake of the gospel. This message to Timothy is no exception. Much suffering exists in our world today, and often in our own lives. How do we bear our sufferings? Perhaps we can offer them to the Lord, praying as St Therese of Lisieux, patroness of the Missions, did; My weak love, my sufferings, blessed by Him, make Him loved far and wide".

#### **Gospel: Luke 17: 11-19**

This passage from Luke is often read on Thanksgiving Day in the U.S. telling a tale, as it were, of the need for our prayerful gratitude to our Lord. Unlike the most grateful Naaman in the First Reading, 9 of the 10 lepers cured by Christ accepted their healing without acknowledging the great gift they had been given.
