Pentecost Sunday Psalter - Week 4 - Year C 19th May 2013

First Reading: Acts 2:1-11

Power can be used in at least two ways: it can be unleashed, or it can be harnessed. The Holy Spirit works both ways. At Pentecost, he exploded on the scene. Thousands were affected by one burst of God's power. But the Spirit also works through the Church for the long haul. Through prayer, community and service, Christians are provided with staying power.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 103 Send forth your Spirit, O Lord, and renew the face of the earth -

Second Reading: Romans 8:8-17

Just as the Spirit casts off the fear of the disciples in the First Reading, Paul reminds us that the same Spirit dwelling in us can take us far beyond any human limitations. We need not be slaves to our unspiritual selves or the misdeeds of the body. Death gives way to life, mortality to immortality, slavery to true freedom.

Gospel: John 14:15-16, 23-26

It can be difficult to see beyond our reality. We live lives that are narrowly focused, conditioned by our environment, traditions and habits. So it is with the disciples. They have a sense that their relationship with Jesus is about to change. Some may even fear that their relationship is coming to an end. But Jesus offers reassurance and hope, the Spirit or the Advocate to be with them for ever. The Spirit will be a teacher unlocking the riches within them.

The 2013 Parish Assembly

Bishop Donal Mc Keown, the special guest speaker at the recent Parish Assembly admitted to the audience that the parish of St. Anne's had been part of his salvation during some of the worst times of "The troubles".

"It was a larger parish then," he recalled. "It was a time when I taught across at Knock in East Belfast, so giving assistance to the Parish priest Fr. Kelly, and being involved with so many of the congregation helped put the disturbances on the streets in perspective."

Saying that as he moved on he had left part of his heart in St. Anne's, Bishop Mc Keown emphasised that from the days of Pope John Paul 11 the church had encouraged the laity to become more involved with the practice of our faith. "Everything should be about building schools of prayer; we must help people to become people of prayer with hope dominant," John Paul had instructed.

"Parishes, particularly in this Year of Faith should be helping better understanding of, and sharing the faith," Bishop Mc Keown said.

"The aim is building vibrant and sustainable local structures of faith in which everyone, particularly our youth, can play a part." Schools the Bishop pointed out, have important roles in developing faith, but more important is the crucial role that families can and must have in passing on the faith. "The drive must be to build relationships in families, in the parish, where faith can prosper," he stressed.

Other speakers at the Assembly included Parish Pastoral Council Chairperson Carole O'Hara, Jim Mc Loughlin- an open and welcoming parish, Vincent Burkefaith and worship and Oonagh Cushley-passing on the faith and Jim Deeds from the Living Church office.
