First Reading: Leviticus 19:1-2, 17-18

One of the most challenging sentences in the book of Leviticus is found here; "You must love your neighbor as yourself". While anger, bitterness and hatred may cause us to bear grudges, as disciples we are to reveal the compassion and love of Christ to everyone. "Be holy, for I, the Lord your God, am holy".

> **Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 102** The Lord is compassion and love -

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 3:16-23

The temple in Jerusalem stood as the visible sign of God's presence in the world. St Paul writes to explain to the people that God is present in the community of believers rather than in a particular building. Each member of the community belongs to the one church of God.

Gospel Mathew 5:38:48

Today, Jesus challenges his disciples. When they are hurt or betrayed they are to turn the other cheek. Jesus begins with the ancient law described in Leviticus but he goes far beyond it. Jesus not only asks his disciples to love their neighbor but to love their enemies. This is to remove the restrictions of the old law regarding love. Nobody should be excluded from Christian love.
