First Reading: Isaiah 66:18-21

To be driven from home is perhaps the most terrifying experience – one embedded into Irish psyche. Yet fugitives – from Irish famine, Tsarist progrom or Nazi persecution – have spread learning and culture. The fugitive becomes the missionary. Is there a seed of the Christian notion of baptismal priesthood here: the mission of unfolding God in daily living? And, at the end, of ministerial priesthood serving the unfolders?

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 116 Go out to the whole world; and proclaim the Good News -

Second Reading: Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

The idea of God administering discipline seems as out-of-date as a schoolmaster with a cane – even shocking. But doesn't it resonate with real life? A child psychologist once told me that often children from families where anything goes crave boundaries. Limits become signs of love.

Gospel: Luke 13:22-30

Salvation is one of the great words of faith to describe what Jesus has done. Imagination can release its power and speak it into our lives. Is it drawn from water? Most early believers lived near the sea – the bearer of food, trade and death. Drowning was familiar to them as only to islanders today; being "saved" a physical reality experienced by many.
