> The Most Holy Trinity 26th May Psalter Week 4 - Year C

First Reading: Proverbs 8:22-31

Australian Aboriginal people speak about the beginning o time. They call it the Dreamtime. There were no landmarks visible and the earth was flat. We hear echoes of such mythology in the First Reading. We are in the dreamtime when the Creator makes the earth. It is an act of playfulness and joy. The creation gives delight to the Creator.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 8

How great is your name, O Lord our God, through all the earth!

Second Reading: Romans 5:1-5

Suffering is part of the reality of our human condition. Our Christian faith does not preserve us from the reality of suffering in our lives but gives us a different way of looking at the world. Suffering has a redemptive quality through which we grow in understanding of God and the World.

Gospel: John 16:12-15

Jesus has many things he wishes to tell the disciples but realizes that speaking them all explicitly to them could lead to sensory overload. He will send the Spirit to continue his saving work for the world in and through them. The Spirit that Jesus promises to his disciples is a guide into the truth. The truth, John reminds us in another place, will set us free. The relationship between Jesus and his disciples is never static. It is a dynamic of dialogue and journey.
