Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time 30th June Psalter Week 1 - Year C

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:16, 19-21

The cloak symbolizes the personality and status of the owner, and the prophet's action suggests that Elisha is being called to succeed him. Elisha's request to bid farewell to his parents seems to be reluctantly granted by Elijah, who possibly expected a more immediate response on Elijah's part.

Second Reading: Galatians 5:1, 13-18

As the poacher-turned gamekeeper, St Paul is able in a remarkable way to offer guidance to the people he addresses on so many different aspects of life and Christian living. In today's second reading St Paul speaks to us of freedom and liberty, this is what Jesus calls us to.

Gospel: Luke 9:51-62

Those who have had the opportunity and privilege to study the scriptures in some depth will know that in the Gospel of St Luke the story of Jesus' ministry unfolds in the form of a journey towards Jerusalem. Therefore the words chosen for today's passage are not accidental but rather loaded with meaning.
