Psalter Week 3 - Year C 3rd March 2013

First Reading: Exodus 3:1-8, 13-15

The call of Moses follows the traditional format for a prophetic call. There is the manifestation of the divine, the burning bush which was not being consumed, the call, the refusal with an excuse given – not in this text, but Moses claims he cannot speak 'Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh, and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?' Reassurance comes in the revelation of the divine name, the same one who has been with Abraham and his ancestors from the beginning.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 102 The Lord is compassion and love -

Second Reading: Philippians 1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12

In this reading St. Paul reminds his readers that the Lord was present to guide the people of Israel through the wilderness. The Exodus story retains a relevance for Paul's audience and for us reading today. The biblical stories contain eternal truths which continue to guide our lives. St Paul presents a stark warning: 'let anyone who thinks that he is safe take heed lest he fall'.

Gospel: Luke 13: 1-9

Today's Gospel treats one of the eternal questions – the problem of evil. Luke presents two recent tragedies which the people of the time were questioning, with the quite natural query – what did they do to deserve that? Jesus states that the tragedies were not a consequence of sin, for bad things do not necessarily happen to bad people – at least not in this world. He also uses the events as a teaching opportunity, to demonstrate the fragility of human life.
