Second Sunday of Christmas 5th January 2014 Year A Psalter Week 2

First Reading: Esslesiasticus (Sirach) 24:1-2, 8-12

Ecclesiasticus is also known as Sirach because it was written by the Jewish scholar Jesus ben Sirach approximately 180 BC. It is not known why it came to be called "Ecclesiasticus" which is Greek for "the Church (book or thing)". Perhaps it was called the Church because the early Church Fathers used the book extensively for doctrinal instruction.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 147 The word was made flesh and lived among us -

Second Reading: Ephesians 1:3-6, 15-18

Ephesus was a large city on the coast of what is today called Turkey. In the time of St Paul it was an important political, commercial and religious centre. We learn from the Acts of the Apostles that Paul spent about three years there. Many scholars doubt whether Paul was the actual author of the letter or if it was written by a close associate of Paul to the nascent Christian community of Ephesus.

Gospel John 1:1-8

Our Gospel reading is the great prologue from the Gospel of John. The driving force of this prologue is the incarnation of the Word of God. The prologue acts in the same way as an overture to an opera. Before the opera actually begins the overture reveals the themes that will dominate the opera as it unfolds. John's prologue introduces us to the main character of the coming Gospel.
