Twenty Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

8th September Psalter Week 3 - Year C

First Reading: Wisdom9:13-18

The writer of the First Reading is struck with the awesomeness of God and asks "Who can divine the will of God?" Thousands of years later, we continue to ask the same question. Despite struggling with not having all the answers, we are assured that Wisdom comes from God and it is only through this wisdom that can we hear, not to mention understand, what he has planned for us.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 89
O Lord, you have been our refuge from one generation to the next -

Second Reading: Philemon 9-10, 12-17

This letter from Paul to Philemon is the shortest of St Paul's letters and possibly the most personal. During his imprisonment in Rome, a runaway slave called Onesimus came to Paul and was converted to Christianity. Paul asks his master Philemon to give up the right to punish Onesimus despite facing possible ridicule from his community. This letter is a radical call to discipleship.

Gospel: Luke 14:25-33

The words of today's Gospel are tough words, but Jesus knew they were tough when he said them. Out of love he wanted those who wished to follow him to understand fully the cost of discipleship. The essential condition for true discipleship, expected by Christ, was and still is total dedication, total commitment of oneself to him.

"Were you abused when you were in an Institution?

Talk to us - we will listen"

The Historic Institutional Abuse Inquiry is an independent Inquiry set up to investigate abuse of children in residential institutions (but not schools) in Northern Ireland between 1922 and 1995. Abuse could be sexual or physical abuse, or emotional abuse or neglect. The Inquiry has an Acknowledgment Forum where you can come and tell experienced professionals in private, and in confidence, about abuse you experienced. Another part of the inquiry will investigate abuse, and then make recommendations to the Northern Ireland government. You can choose to talk to both parts, or to either part, of the Inquiry. If you were abused in an institution, or saw others being abused, the Inquiry wants to talk to you. It hopes that as many people as possible who experienced abuse in institutions, or witnessed others being abused, will come forward to help the Inquiry investigate the way these children were treated, and what should be done about it. If you know someone who was abused encourage them to contact us.
