Parish Pastoral Council Meeting - February

After the opening prayer which dealt with using the special talents of all parishioners to their best use for the parish community, members discussed the forthcoming election for new PPC members, the continuing (but understandable) delays in having a new parish website up and running, plans to establish a Living Youth project, a proposal for a special parish mission for next year and the "In Joyful Hope" event on February 25 (in the church at 8.00 pm).

The program leading up to the PPC elections and the contents of information packs for parishioners interested in standing for appointment were agreed, as were the personal testimonies of current members that will be used to explain something of what prompted them to become involved with the Council.

Members heard that the new website arrangements were nearing completion and set up a small group to consider running from September a monthly film show in the Parish Centre featuring the acclaimed productions of Irish film company Radharc Films.
