Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time 9th March 2014 Year A Psalter Week 1

First Reading: Genesis 2:7-9, 3:1-7

Our human condition means we are attracted to sin. Sin is not something we are, it is something we do. From the moment we are created we are filled with the breath and Spirit of God. Through God's Spirit in us we become enlivened; it is our very life. The writers of the creation story recognize that sin causes us to judge others superficially, seeing them from the outside only.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 50 Have mercy on us, O Lord for we have sinned -

Second Reading: Romans 5:12-19

Paul superimposes the disaster of Adam's sin with the greater victory over sin won by Christ on the cross. But Christ's victory far outweighs Adam's action in the garden. Whereas Adam's sin makes us sinners, Christ's obedience obliterates that identity. It penetrates us and fills us with grace. Spiritually, the prelapsarian state is restored so that once again we are filled with divine life and the grace of God's salvation.

Gospel Mathew 4:1-11


