Fifth Sunday of Easter 18th May 2014 Year A Psalter Week 1

First Reading: Acts: 2:1-17

Here we have a picture of the early church's idealistic community. The point at issue here is the unity of the church and the apostles' concern to mediate and reconcile differences between conflicting parties. An opportunity to address issues of xenophobia. An impressive aspect of the early church is its ability to adapt to changing needs of the community to which it is ministering. Note that the community is consulted.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 32 May your love be upon us, O Lord, as we place all our hope in you -

Second Reading: 1 Peter 2:4-9

Here we have the wonderful metaphor of the Church as a spiritual edifice constructed of "living stones": the Christian community built on the foundation stone that is Christ himself. The believers are given an elaborate new identity in terms originally applied to Israel, with a Christian twist.

Gospel John 14:1-12

By the time the Gospel of John is being written the idea of parousia as imminent has give way to a longer-term understanding of an encounter with Christ at one's own personal death. It is Jesus presenting himself as God's revelation. Jesus manifests the presence and mind of God in the world and to know Jesus is to know God, the desire of every human heart.
