Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time 17th August 2014 Year A Psalter Week 4

First Reading: Isaiah 56:1, 6-7

This is a most interesting and juxtaposition of verses and the use of verse 1 as a preamble greatly strengthens the already powerful verses 6-7. Before we get to the disturbing challenge that 'foreigners' are going to be saved, we are reminded of the essence of the justice of YHWH, & the desire that we emulate it or at least try. After this marker is put down, the job of work that comes with it acknowledged, then comes a very bitter pill to swallow.

Second Reading: Romans 11:13-15, 29-32

Paul here shows his great & growing grasp of the universal church. One can hear his passion when he savours the integration of all that is 'gentile' into the body Christ. For Paul this is more than teaching, it is a lived reality. Perhaps more than any other he can testify about the road from serious sin to salvation. He knows the deep joy of the return, and wants it for all, including those termed outsiders!

Gospel: Matthew 14: 22-33

BRIEFING NOTE ON TRÓCAIRE'S RESPONSE TO HUMANITARIAN CRISIS IN IRAQ (THE PERSECUTION OF CHRISTIANS AND OTHER MINORITIES) 12 August 2014

BACKGROUND - Trócaire, the overseas development agency of the Catholic Church in Ireland, has committed humanitarian aid to respond to the urgent needs of civilians from minority communities including Christians in northern Iraq, who have fled their homes under threat of attack and persecution from the militant group, Islamic State (formerly (ISIS).

A major humanitarian crisis has unfolded in the region; with 850,000 people fleeing in the last two months alone to escape brutal attacks by IS, as it seeks to extend its control across the region. The total displaced since the start of the year stands at 1.4 million.

IS broke from Al Qaeda in Syria earlier this year and has grown in strength, particularly in Syria, where it has been fighting the regime of Bashar Al Assad. Since early 2014, it has had much of northern Syria under its control. The aim of IS is to create a purely Islamic Sunni Muslim state. It claims authority over all Muslims and aspires to bring much of the Muslim-inhabited regions of the world under its direct political control, beginning with territory in the Levant region, which includes Jordan, Palestine, Lebanon, Cyprus and an area in southern Turkey that includes Hatay.

IS' presence on both sides of the Syria-Iraq border has been building since the beginning of the year and in July a major offensive was launched, which saw it

secure a huge amount of territory and advance towards the Iraqi capital of Baghdad. It launched a massive offensive in June 2014 and since then the group has increased its threats of violence in Lebanon and Jordan adding to the fears of populations already hosting 2 million Syrian refugees. The movement is brutal in

its treatment of all minorities including Christians, Yazidis and Turkmen. The lives of thousands of people from minorities in Iraq, including Christians, Yazidis and Turkmen, are in critical danger, as this humanitarian crisis escalates. People trapped in conflict zones or trying to escape are seeking shelter wherever they can find safety, often in churches and temples, and are in urgent need of

emergency aid.

TRÓCAIRE'S RESPONSE: - Trócaire has committed an initial €300,000 to support our Caritas partners to respond to this evolving emergency and assess the needs of vulnerable populations, the most pressing of which are food, water and essential living supplies. We echo the call of Pope Francis for prayers for Christians and all other populations that are suffering at the present time.
