## Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2014 Year A Psalter Week 2

## First Reading: Isaiah 55: 1-3

The passage from the Prophet Isaiah used in today's liturgy is taken from the conclusion of the part traditionally known as the Book of Consolation. There is the promise of abundance of good things from God, not only materially, but also spiritually. Food and drink are symbols of the everlasting covenant. The invitation is to turn to the One who can give all things and quench all hunger and thirst.

## Responsorial Psalm: 144 You open wide your hand, O lord, you grant our desires –

## Second Reading: Romans 8: 35, 37-38

In this song of thanksgiving, we hear an expression of the author's faith. Some verses earlier, the audience have been reminded that the Spirit of God dwells in them; this is a consolation to those who are experiencing persecution because of their faith. In the fullness of his promise, the disasters of this world do not take us from Christ; death no longer has the final word, in fact it brings us closer to him.

## Gospel: Matthew 14: 13:21

The prophecy of the First Reading is fulfilled, as by his actions and words, Jesus calls on the people to come to him and have life. He had touched their hearts as they heard his words: he had opened their minds as they saw his works. In this Gospel, we encounter Jesus seeking a quiet place for himself; yet the crowds hunger so much for him that they come after him. This is another moment where the people see the love of God made visible in Christ.

## **Pope Francis Appeals for Prayers for Peace**

On Sunday, 20th July, Pope Francis called on the faithful to pray for Christians fleeing the Iraqi city of Mosul, and to "persevere in prayer for those situations of tension and conflict that continue in parts of the Middle East and the Ukraine".

The tragedy of war and the horrendous suffering of the Syrian people continue without respite. Pax Christi International believes that this armed confrontation – which continues to destabilize the region affecting mostly civilians – can be stopped if the international community focuses on promoting serious political negotiations and discourages violence in all its forms.

The death toll in Syria is over 160,000 people while more than 680,000 people have been injured. Almost half the Syrian population has been displaced, including close to three million people (Source: **UNHCR**) who are registered as

refugees in neighbouring countries, where resources are not sufficient to fulfill their needs. <u>Nonviolent civilian initiatives thwarted by arms flows</u> <u>fuelling the war</u> Pax Christi International highlights once again that in 2011 thousands of Syrians went into the streets peacefully calling for freedom and reforms. Our movement has continued to support civilians who are trying to address the conflict through nonviolent means and actions. We want to underline

the important efforts being made by peaceful Syrians to sustain the fabric of society. Those courageous women and men are essential to the new Syria that is in the making. However, international actors – including governments – are fuelling the armed conflict by supplying or financing weapons and ammunitions, training combatants and even sending military contingents to one or more sides. **Some think-tanks** have made efforts to document arms transfers but, in general, there is a serious lack of accountability in this regard. The European Union imposed an arms embargo on the Syrian government that lasted for only a few months.

Pax Christi International believes that peace is possible and echoes the words of Pope Francis, who has called on Syria and the international community to "boldly negotiate the peace long awaited and long overdue. For further information view the Pax Christi Website.
