Third Sunday in Ordinary Time 25th January 2015 Year B Psalter 3

First Reading: Jonah 3:1-5, 10

Jonah repents and obeys God. In doing so he brings about a tremendously positive outcome for the Ninevites. Jonah's repentance says something of the nature of all repentance – a change of mind and behavior often involving an openness – here to go to a place of avoidance and fear. It is only in this open state we can discern the will of God and decide to enact it in our lives and become true disciples.

Responsorial Psalm: 24 Lord make me know your ways –

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:29-31

In this passage we read of Paul's conviction that the time of Christ's return, the Day of Judgment, and the fulfilment of salvation for that time draws near. To prepare for that time, Paul exhorts all Christians to holy indifference toward the world. All worldly things are fleeting, everything will pass away.

Gospel: Mark 1:14-20

Today, we begin to read the account of Jesus' ministry as told by Mark. Following his baptism in the Rover Jordan and preparation in the wilderness, Jesus takes up his ministry. "The time" a decisive moment appointed by God, "is fulfilled". The good news is that the Kingdom of God is now at hand for all who are ready to receive it. There is something compelling about messenger and message that those hearing it – here the fishermen – leave their nets and become disciples.

Parish Pastoral Council - News brief

At the January meeting of the PPC members discussed their various views on **the mission and context of a parish. Doing that which is meaningful for** parishioners was highlighted as significant, and among the areas thought essential for parishioners were:

- the parish responsibility to dialogue, respect and inclusion
- the need to aim for a unifying spirit, making the parish family friendly and welcoming
- the desire for more collaboration among parishes
- the importance of being at the forefront of developments
- the quality of lives in family, community and society and
- visible public participation by the parish in the organised activities of local communities.

Members heard that some of the diocesan planning was to form large parish groupings, of roughly 20,000 parishioners. Parishes however would remain distinct and St. Anne's would possibly be linked with Our lady Queen of Peace, St. Luke's, Christ the Redeemer and the Church of the Nativity.

A discussion about the importance of communications and the need to strengthen all systems of keeping parishioners up to date about parish activities will be continued at the February meeting. Gerry Carson, Secretary, PPC.
