# Second Sunday of Lent 1st March 2015 Year B Psalter 2

#### First Reading: Genesis 22;1-2, 9-13, 15-18

A modern reader cannot but be shocked by the divine demand for a human life in ritualistic sacrifice. What kind of God is this? Abraham lived in a brutal world where it was not at all strange for a human being to be offered in sacrifice to appease a vengeful deity. We must take the reading as a whole. Abraham moves from accepting it is moral to offer human sacrifice to experiencing a generous and loving God who provides his own sacrifice.

# Second Reading: Romans 8:31-34

Could anyone accuse those that God has chosen? The power of these comforting words of St. Paul is appreciated when we focus on the word "accuse". The Accuser is a malevolent spiritual being who accuses humanity before the court of God. Those who have faith in Jesus need have no fear of such malignant forces.

# **Gospel: Mark 9:2-10**

What is God really like? If he were to come down among us what type of a person would he be? The answer has already been given to these questions. It is Jesus Christ. The significance of God's self-manifestation in Jesus Christ can never be over emphasized given the strange and downright destructive theologies that can exist among those who call themselves Christian. We do not meet Jesus Christ simply in religious observation but also in social justice. Both are needed for a meaningful counter with God.

## 2015 St. Brigid's Lecture

Cardinal Peter Turkson will give a public lecture in St. Brigid's Church, Windsor Avenue, Belfast on at 7.30pm, Wednesday, 4<sup>th</sup> March. The title of the lecture is: *Pope Francis and the Joy of the Gospel: The Social Dimension.* 

Cardinal Turkson is President of the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace in The Vatican. He comes from Ghana; born in 1948, he was Archbishop of Cape Coast, Ghana, 1992-2009. Regarded as "one of Africa's most energetic leaders" he was called to Rome by Pope Benedict XV1 to head the Church's Council for Justice and Peace and reappointed by Pope Francis.

The subject of Cardinal Turkson's lecture is based on Pope Francis' Apostolic Exhortation on the proclamation of the Gospel in today's world. The Cardinal will pay particular attention to the social dimension of evangelization as outlined in Chapter Four of the Pope's document where Pope Francis "raises social issues of great importance for the future of humanity" such as justice, care for the vulnerable, peace, ecumenical and interreligious dialogue, religious freedom. The Pope makes explicit the inescapable social dimension of the Gospel message and encourages all Christians to demonstrate it by their words, attitudes and deeds.
