Fifth Sunday of Lent

22nd March 2015 Year B Psalter 1

First Reading: Jeremiah 31:31-34

John Lennon's song *Imagine* proclaimed a world without religious, political or social divisions. Although it was fundamentally atheistic in its ideology there is something inexplicably charming in its simplistic utopianism. It resonates with a deep need for peace. In the reading Jeremiah calls upon the people to imagine a future free from religious and political bigotry. However, Jeremiah's vision is founded on the promise of God and not human fantasy.

Responsorial Psalm: 50 A pure heart create for me, O God --

Second Reading: Hebrews 5:7-9

One way of reading the letter to the Hebrews is as a theological reflection on the priesthood and sacrifice of Christ. Blessed Columba Marmion in his Christ the Ideal of the Priest states that the priesthood of Jesus is the result of his humanity. It is not Christ's divinity makes him a priest. Effective priestly ministry is born out of our connection to all humanity; to be able to empathise and sympathise.

Gospel: John 12:20-30

The cross is the premier symbol of Christianity. No matter the culture of theological tradition, some form of the cross will denote the Church. Crosses all bear testimony to the fact that Christianity is born not out of the teaching of Jesus but out of his sacrifice on the cross.
