Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time 21st June 2015 Year B Psalter 4

First Reading: Job 3:1, 8-11

The cliché talks about the patience of Job. Yet, after losing everything, his family, his prosperity, his health Job cries out with the great question 'Why?' It turns out that his friends are next to useless in providing an answer to his question. Finally, in this passage, the Lord comes in a storm to speak to Job. Through a series of questions, he invites Job to a new vision of divine sovereignty over creation.

Responsorial Psalm 106: O give thanks to the Lord, for his love endures forever –

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:14-17

Paul writes to the Corinthians about the dignity of his apostolic mission, his sufferings and his hope. As an ambassador for Christ, he has been entrusted with a ministry of reconciliation and of the New Covenant. Yet for the Christian the world has changed totally. The Resurrection means we are living in a new creation. How does this impact your life?

Gospel: Mark 4:35-41

The disciples are portrayed by Mark in what might consider a strange manner. Often they do the opposite of what a follower of Jesus should do and are "shown up" by a minor character. Despite being close to Jesus they have no idea who he

is; they are frightened despite his presence and take him not to care for their welfare. Jesus comes to their aid and demonstrates his divine nature by controlling the elements, yet the disciples do not recognize this manifestation, instead asking "Who can this be" A question we all have to answer for ourselves.

A Reflection on the forthcoming Ordination of Deacon Conor McCarthy

..... a priest is a living stem, bearing sacraments as its fruits: he gives you the body and blood of Christ: he gives you, if you faithfully confess before him, Christ's own absolution. And that's not all, the man who bears the Sacrament is sacramental himself; he is, one might almost say, himself a walking sacrament. He is the appointed flag for Christ's people to rally round: the centre of unity to

which we hold in every place. Just exactly what a priest is, you can best see in the Holy Eucharist.

In a great part of the holy action he is, of course, no more than the voice of the congregation. Some of the prayers we say with him, some we let him say for us: it makes little difference. Or again, in receiving the sacrament, the priest is in the same position as any other Christian, receiving the body and blood of Christ. But there is a moment where the priest steps into the place of Christ himself, to do what Christ did, to bless and to break, to present the mysterious sacrifice before God Almighty.

It is much the same in absolution. If you have gone and made your confession to the priest, you will understand what I say, when I tell you Christ speaks in him the absolving words.

These moments, certainly, are exceptional in the activity of a priest; exceptional, but still not disconnected with his whole life or character. The man who is as Christ in the Sacrament is not just like anyone else ever: he bears the stamp. He is always, as I said before, a sort of walking sacrament, a token of Christ wherever he is: in him Christ sets up the standard of his kingdom and calls us to the colours.
