First Reading: Numbers 11:25-19

Even though Moses is getting negative messages within the community and is asked to banish the ones prophesying outside of the parameters, he takes a different stand. He hopes and prays that they all have the spirit to prophesy and bear witness to God's way.

Responsorial Psalm 18

The precepts of the Lord gladden the heart -

Second Reading: James 5:1-6

James is addressing those who have greed, gluttony, lust for power in their lives and have set their hearts on riches. He names the deeds that depict their exploitative nature and spells out the decay and misery that await them for what they have done in an evil way, and indeed the evil itself they subscribed to in life.

Gospel: Mark 9:38-43,45,47-48

Jesus makes it quite clear how evil and good manifest themselves. Anyone who is for him is not evil. Giving in his name is a sign of goodness, the antithesis and antidote to evil. But he is strong in maintaining that evil gets its own results and we must sacrifice all to keep it away and bring goodness and sacrificial love to the fore in our lives as disciples.
