Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time 25th October 2015 Year B Psalter 2

First Reading: Jeremiah 31:7-9

Jeremiah tries to restore hope to the remnants of Israel who are in exile by prophesying a return to Jerusalem. Thus, his message is that they should not remain sad but happy because the Lord will save them and bring them back to their own land. This is highlighted by his description of a gathering of the poor ones, and walk on level road towards streams of water, a symbol of God's blessings of great abundance.

Responsorial Psalm 125 What marvels the Lord worked for us! Indeed we were glad –

Second Reading: Hebrews 5:1-6

The author of the Letter to the Hebrews describes the special vocation of a priest, that is, his role as mediator between God and his people. He says, however, that a priest who is chosen from among the people also bears the mark of a sinner which should make him more sympathetic and understanding for the weak and ignorant.

Gospel: Mark 10:46-52

The Gospel of Mark reports that Jesus is on his way to Jerusalem when he passed by Jericho, one of the oldest cities of Palestine. Upon leaving the city to proceed to his real destination, Jesus, and his disciples came across a blind man called Bartimaeus, Jesus cured his blindness. After that Bartimaeus became an avid follower of Jesus and an active member of the Christian community.
