Biblical Walk with the Blessed Mother

We finished our Biblical Walk with Mary on Friday 4th March after 6 sessions in which we immersed ourselves in the Scripture passages related to Mary in the Gospels and Ch.12 of the book of Revelation. The work book also directed us to passages in the Old testament which threw light on Mary's role as Handmaid of the Lord, Mother of the Messiah Jesus, as the Queen Mother and as the new Eve.

In our study "the First Good News" proclamation Genesis 3:15 became an important text in our understanding of the title "Woman" used by Jesus at the Marriage Feast of Cana and on the Cross when Jesus gave Mary to us to be our spiritual mother. One participant spoke of the joy she had in being reminded that Mary is her mother in heaven along with her earthly mother who is deceased. The

DVD lesson summaries given by Dr Edward Sri reinforced our Scriptural rediscoveries about Mary our mother who pondered all things in her heart "and is the best disciple of her Son and our model of faith. Our six week pilgrimage with Mary was both enlightening and enriching.
