Third Sunday of Easter 10th April 2016 Year C Psalter 3

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 5:27-32, 40-41

The phenomenal growth of believers in Jerusalem evoked annoyance and fear among the clerical Jewish leaders. Peter was unfazed by bullying reprimands. His famous reply "obedience to God comes before obedience to other men" set the tone for future relationship of the Jewish establishment and the young church.

Responsorial Psalm: 29
I will praise you Lord, you have rescued me --

Second Reading: Apocalypse 5:11-14

The sacrificial lamb was always important to Hebrew religious worship, especially in the Temple. The Passover Lamb was central to the celebration of Jewish freedom from slavery. As Christ was gradually understood to be the sacrificial victim of the new dispensation, the title Lamb then became Lamb of God. In today's reading, the Lamb is worthy of all praise by all peoples.

Gospel: John 21:1-19

Scholars discuss at length how and why Chapter 21 got attached to John's Gospel with some difficulties arising about the sequence of Jesus' post-Resurrection appearances. Interesting though these discussions are, it is best to focus liturgically on this Sunday's reading as it is, exploring how the events recounted formed the infant Church and can enrich us this weekend.
