First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses encourages the people to look beyond lip service in obedience to God's commands or seeking answers from far away sources, but to look instead into their own hearts in order to understand the message God has for them.

Responsorial Psalm 68 Seek the Lord, you who are poor, and your hearts will revive — Second Reading: Colossians 1:15-20

In this hymn to Jesus, Paul describes in poetic terms how this same Jesus whom he had once persecuted has been revealed to him and to the world as the image of the unseen God, the pattern and model for humanity made possible by his sacrifice on the cross.

Gospel: Luke 10:25-37

The radical nature of Christ's teaching reaches its summit in the story of the Good Samaritan which challenges his listeners to re-examine their prejudice towards Samaritans and all of us to explore our deepest fears and ingrained prejudices against others.
