Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time 2016 Year C Psalter 4

First Reading: 2 Maccabees 7:1-2,9-14

This reading is an abridged version of the account of the martyrdom of a mother and her seven sons. It emphasises both the conviction of the mother and sons to adhere to the tenets of their faith, and it alludes to the theme of the resurrection.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 16

I shall be filled, when I awake, with the sight of your glory, O Lord –

Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 2:16-3:5

These are the first words of the letter from St Paul to a community he helped to found. These are good and kind sentiments; words of encouragement which Paul

wants to convey. It is interesting that he mentions "work" and "word". Or Christian faith is not just something to be spoken about, but something lived in the day to day building up of the Body of Christ. The mention of the Lord in the final sentence seems to allude to the Holy Spirit pointing the Thessalonians to the Father and the Son.

Gospel Reading: Luke 20:27-38

The mention of "seven" goes back to the first reading and to resurrection, Sadduccees did not believe in resurrection and the Pharisees did. The reading is not necessarily about the resurrection but rather the constant barrage that Jesus had to endure in the hope that these learned men might trick him or trip him up. Jesus was well able to settle their argument.
