> Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion 9th April 2017 Year A Psalter 2

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

God is ready to make a pathway through the wilderness and lead his people home. But they reject the Servant's vision. They prefer to remain in the state to which they have become accustomed. They vilify the Servant, who nonetheless remains true to his calling.

> Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 50 My God, My God, why have you forsaken me? –

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

One of the earlier writings of the New Testament (c.57AD) includes this even earlier hymn on the nature of Christ. The Word of God emptied itself into the humanity in Jesus, and even shared our mortal fate. This downward movement was followed by Christ's exhaltation and sovereignty over all creation. By imitating the self-gifting mindset of Jesus we also share in His victory over sin and death.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 26:14-27:66

Jesus heralds God's kingdom by parables, preaching, mercy and miracles, but above all by his own passion, death and resurrection. God is revealed in a new way, on the cross. Jesus surrenders to his fate knowing that God's providence vindicates the just and rescues them from betrayal (Judas), denial (Peter) and deceit (the Sanhedrin). Just as, at the beginning of life, God had safely delivered his Son from a corrupt ruler (Herod), so he would now do at it's end (Pilate)
