# First Reading: Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

Still in times of great oppression, fear and anxiety, Daniel is reassuring his listeners that their all-powerful God is in charge of the world and will send them a leader who will protect them always.

# Gospel: Matthew 17:1-9

# **Dunmurry Walking Group.**

Proposal for consideration - formation of a walking group drawing upon interested individuals in the Dunmurry catchment area.

Forming and promoting a walking group, based largely, but not exclusively, on the church communities within the Dunmurry catchment area would be a convivial and healthy enterprise and would add to and enhance the already established contacts between the respective congregations and parishes in the 'village' area.

An initial programme of three or perhaps four pre-arranged walk routes of between 1.00 and 1.5 hours over the course of the next 2 months would test the popularity of the idea. Dunmurry, being adjacent to the Lagan Valley Regional Park offers many fine options.

Details of date, start time, venue and route, of course, all need to be considered and decided but initially, and in outline, for final agreement, a suggested programme might be:

2 evening walks: start time 6.30/7.00pm - finishing circa 8.00 pm. - venue, start, say Shaw's Bridge, circuit to include Minnowburn, Edenderry, Gilchrist Bridge. Coffee/ biscuits at Mc Cleery Hall or other venue, 2 'daytime' walks - start time - 10.00/10.30 -

finish circa noon - various options eg Belvior Forest Park; Bladon Meadows etc. refreshments as per prior agreement.

Daytime or evening options are suggested to facilitate those who may not be able to attend one or other due to standing commitments.

Generally transport to and from the venue would be arranged within the respective participating groups.

A small voluntary contribution might be appropriate to cover cost of refreshments.

Organising and agreeing a programme would be a joint exercise. A rep from each participating group should be nominated and 'bureaucy' kept to a minimum - but be sufficient to ensure 'success' and a happy, feel good glow as we all head for home. As a target and in order to get the 'programme' underway it is suggested that the first outing might be during the third week of August – let's go for Thursday 17th - day or

evening as seems best to ensure a good response.
