Like all his compatriots, Elijah's faith and trust in God has been shattered. Powerful invading armies had exiled the Hebrews to Babylon and had even destroyed the Temple. The God who had solemnly promised to be with them always to protect them from every harm had failed them utterly.

Gospel: Matthew 14:22-23

In his Gospel, Matthew's focus is on Jesus forming the disciples into a little community, the core of the young Church to be. So, just as Jesus came in the midst of the storm to reassure his disciples, so he is there for the infant church that is frightened by the challenges it faces, torn by desertions and afraid of going down in a hostile sea.
