<u>First</u> World Day of the Poor – 19th November 2017 Message from Pope Francis

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time "Let us love not with words but with deeds" "Poverty challenges us daily in the faces marked by suffering, marginalization, oppression, violence, torture and imprisonment, war, depravation of freedom and dignity, ignorance and illiteracy, medical emergencies and shortage of work, trafficking and slavery, exile, extreme poverty and forced immigration.

Poverty has the face of women, men and children exploited by base interests, crushed by the machinations of power and money".

Tragically in our own time even as ostentatious wealth accumulates in the hands of the privileged few, often in connection with illegal activities and the appalling exploitation of human dignity, there is a scandalous growth of poverty in broad sectors of society throughout our world. Faced with this scenario we cannot remain passive, much less resigned.

I invite the Whole Church to turn their gaze on this day to all who stretch out their hands and plead for solidarity and help. They are our brothers and sisters Everyone is invited to openness and sharing with the poor through concrete signs of solidarity and fraternity To create moments of encounter and friendship. At the heart of the many concrete initiatives carried out on this day should always be prayer. Let us not forget that the Our Father is the prayer of the poor "In this prayer all of us recognise our need to overcome every sign of selfishness"
