First Confession & First Holy Communion

Readings

Isaiah 22: 19-23 St Peter was not the first person in the Bible whose authority was symbolized by keys. Here, Eliakim, the royal steward, hears the Lord saying to him that the key of the House of David will be placed on his shoulder.

Romans 11:33-36 St Paul, having applied all his insight and intelligence to the question of the relationship between the people of the covenant and the new, Christian, covenant, can only conclude by hymning the wisdom of God: 'Who could ever know the mind of the Lord?'

Matthew 16:13-20 The Lord's second question is crucial: 'But you, who do you say I am?' As Christians, we need to be able to answer this question for ourselves, and not simply report what we have heard others say.

Seeing your Life through the Lens of the Gospel: Mt: 16:13-20

- 1. This marks a turning point in the life of Jesus and of the disciples. It is the first time that his disciples recognise him as the Messiah. Recall turning points in your own life when you came to some deeper understanding of who Jesus is.
- **2.** 'Who do you say that I am?' This is possibly the most important question that Jesus puts to us. In your heart of hearts, how do you answer this question?
- **3.** Jesus praises Peter for his faith, and comments that this was not his own doing but a gift of God. Perhaps there have been times when you have been more than usually conscious that faith is a gift. Be thankful for the gift you have received.
- **4.** These are troubled times for the Church, and the promise of Jesus that 'the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it' is an encouragement. What helps you to draw strength from this promise of Jesus? What signs of hope do you see in the Church today?

FACE COVERINGS IN CHURCHES

The Church leaders, following recent consultations with public health authorities, are formally recommending and encouraging the use of face coverings at all Masses and other liturgical celebrations, along with the ongoing maintenance of 2 metre physical distancing.

It should however be noted that some people are exempt from the wearing of face coverings, as outlined in public health agency guidance: https://www.nidirect.gov.uk/articles/coronavirus-covid-19-face-coverings

It has become increasingly clear that the wearing of face coverings, in conjunction with hand washing etc, is likely to reduce the spread of Coronavirus, thus helping to protect others. The use of face coverings is therefore one way in which we can evidence protection for the most vulnerable, support for our health workers and practical love for our neighbour.

• We would ask that all those attending St. Anne's to please wear masks/facecoverings.

<u>Preparation for Sacrament of Reconciliation and First Holy</u> Communion

The Catechetics Council of the Irish Bishops Conference are producing a series of resources which would be very useful in the preparation of children for First Holy Communion. They will consist of three movie episodes (30mins each) with an accompanying worksheet. Episode 1 has already been uploaded and the remaining episodes will be uploaded as they become available.

Episode 1: Preparing to Celebrate the Eucharist – Sacrament of Reconciliation

The sacrament of Reconciliation (or as some call it 'Confession') is the focus for this first lesson.

These series of resources could be used by parents, schools or parishes in preparing children for First Holy Communion and could form the foundation for a short refresher programme for children who will be making their First Holy Communion over the next few weeks.

All episodes and resources are being made available and delivered through the iCatholic player.

Pray As You Go

- This is a daily prayer session, designed to go with you wherever you go, to help you pray whenever you find time, but particularly whilst travelling to and from work, study, etc.
- A new prayer session is produced every day of the week and one session for the weekend. It is not a 'Thought for the Day', a sermon or a bible-study, but rather a framework for your own prayer.
- Lasting between ten and thirteen minutes, it combines music, scripture and some questions for reflection.
