<u>Music in St. Anne's</u> – Would you be willing to help with our liturgical music in church? Do you like to sing? Do you play a musical instrument? Have you been an important part of our music ministry before Covid-19? We would love to have you share once again your talent for music! Come along to a meeting on **Wednesday 25th May at 7.30pm**. Everyone is most welcome, and you only need a love for music and worship. Why not bring along a friend too? The Church teaches that music forms an integral part of solemn liturgy. The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy states that the musical tradition of the Church is a "treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art". The main reason for this pre-eminence is that, as a combination of sacred music and words, it forms a necessary or integral part of solemn liturgy, according to Sacrosanctum Concilium.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church notes that composition and singing of inspired psalms, often accompanied by musical instruments, "were already closely linked to the liturgical celebrations of the Old Covenant". The Church continues this tradition "making melody to the Lord with all your heart" (Eph 5:19). As St Augustine of Hippo stated: "He who sings prays twice."

The Church teaches that song and music fulfil their function as signs in a manner even more significant when they are "more closely connected... with the liturgical action".

These signs should fulfil three criteria:

A beauty expressive of prayer.

The unanimous participation of the assembly.

The solemn character of the celebration.

"How I wept, deeply moved by your hymns, songs, and the voices that echoed through your Church! What emotion I experienced in them! Those sounds flowed into my ears distilling the truth in my heart. A feeling of devotion surged within me, and tears streamed down my face – tears that did me good (St Augustine).

The Church teaches that the harmony of signs (song, music, words, and actions) is even more expressive and fruitful "when expressed in the cultural richness of the People of God who celebrate".

Hence, religious singing by the faithful, according to Sacrosanctum Concilium, "is to be intelligently fostered so that in devotions and sacred exercises as well as in liturgical services", in conformity with the Church's norms, "the voices of the faithful may be heard".

<u>Vocations</u>

As Catholics, we firmly believe that God has a plan for our lives! He calls some to marriage, some to the priesthood, and others to religious life or to live as generous single people. **Sunday 8th May 2022 is the World Day of Prayer for Vocations.** It is also known as **"Good Shepherd Sunday."** The Lord asked his disciples to "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). Please

pray that young men and women hear and respond generously to the Lord's call to the priesthood, diaconate, religious life, societies of apostolic life or secular institutes.

Pray also for the priests who have ministered to you throughout your life, both living and dead. Encourage your children, grandchildren, or other young people to consider a vocation as a priest or religious brother or sister.

As a priest your ministry is not only at the altar, but it is also in the world, sanctifying it by your life and ministry. *Archbishop Dermot Farrell*

Liturgy of the Word

FIRST READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 13:14. 43-52

Paul and Barnabas carried on from Perga till they reached Antioch in Pisidia. Here they went to synagogue on the sabbath and took their seats.

When the meeting broke up many Jews and devout converts joined Paul and Barnabas and in their talks with them Paul and Barnabas urged them to remain faithful to the grace God had given them.

The next sabbath almost the whole town assembled to hear the word of God. When they saw the crowds, the Jews, prompted by jealousy, used blasphemies, and contradicted everything Paul said. Then Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly. 'We had to proclaim the word of God to you first, but since you have rejected it, since you do not think yourselves worthy of eternal life, we must turn to the pagans. For this is what the Lord commanded us to do when he said: "I have made you a light for the nations, so that my salvation may reach the ends of the earth."

It made the pagans very happy to hear this and they thanked the Lord for his message; all who were destined for eternal life became believers. Thus the word of the Lord spread through the whole countryside.

But the Jews worked upon some of the devout women of the upper classes and the leading men of the city and persuaded them to turn against Paul and Barnabas and expel them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in defiance and went off to Iconium; but the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

SECOND READING

I, John saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe, and language; they were standing in front of the throne and in front of the Lamb, dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. They shouted aloud, I answered him,

'You can tell me, my lord. 'Then he said, 'These are the people who have been through the great persecution, and because they have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb, they now stand in front of God's throne and serve him day and night in his sanctuary; and the One who sits on the throne will spread his tent over them. They will never hunger or thirst again; neither the sun nor scorching wind will ever plague them, because the Lamb who is at the throne will be their shepherd and will lead them to springs of living water; and God will wipe away all tears from their eyes.'
