### **Liturgy of the Word**

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 14:21-27

**P**aul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith.

'We all have to experience many hardships' they said, 'before we enter

the kingdom of God.'

In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.

**O**n their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.

When Judas had gone Jesus said:




'Now has the Son of Man been glorified, and in him God has been glorified. If God has been glorified in him, God will in turn glorify him in himself, and will glorify him very soon.
