Remember your experiences of growing in understanding and truth.

Perhaps the Spirit guided you through the words of someone close to you, or through the words and actions of people you read about or saw on TV. Or maybe understanding came to you when praying or reflecting on your life. Remember and give thanks for the people who have helped you to greater wisdom on your journey through life.

FIRST READING

A reading from the Book of Proverbs 8:22-31

The Wisdom of God cries out:

The Lord created me when his purpose first unfolded, before the oldest of his works. From everlasting I was firmly set, from the beginning, before earth came into being. The deep was not, when I was born, there were no springs to gush with water.



Before the mountains were settled, before the hills, I came to birth: before he made the earth, the countryside, or the first grains of the world's dust. When he fixed the heavens firm. I was there. when he drew a ring on the surface of the deep, when he thickened the clouds above, when he fixed fast the springs of the deep, when he assigned the sea its boundariesand the waters will not invade the shorewhen he laid down the foundations of the earth. I was by his side, a master craftsman, delighting him day after day, ever at play in his presence, at play everywhere in his world, delighting to be with the sons of men.
